Bromelkamp Company LLC Foundation Awards Three Grants Targeting Literacy

Minneapolis, MN; June 30, 2016 – The Bromelkamp Foundation is a program at Bromelkamp Company LLC established with two primary goals: 1) To be responsive to the nonprofit needs of our employees' communities; and 2) Provide a valuable grantmakers learning opportunity to Bromelkamp staff. At Bromelkamp Company, many employees have previous work experience in the field of both private and public funding and grantmaking. This is the underpinning for Bromelkamp's commitment to excellent customer service. The Foundation keeps the company connected to the work of its clients through an annual grant process. Each year, two Bromelkamp employees conduct a grant round using Bromelkamp's online tools: eGrant.net for the application, and Reviewer for the committee scoring and recommendation process. Grant funds come from a share of company profits; typically, three grants are awarded annually. The Board of Directors is comprised of the entire Bromelkamp Company staff, who review the committee's recommendations and approve the final awards.

The Bromelkamp Foundation serves non-profits in the communities where Bromelkamp Company employees live and work, which include counties in Minnesota, Michigan, Ohio, and North Carolina. From those communities, the Foundation received 23 completed applications by the deadline of April 15, 2016 for this year's funding priority of literacy. There were a total of 45 volunteer reviewers from Bromelkamp's current client and prospective clients. The Foundation was pleased to award \$1,000 each to this year's recipients: LDA Minnesota for the Learning Connections program, the GMCC/Division of Indian Work for the Agindaasodaa! (Let's Read) Program, and the Lyndale Neighborhood Association for the Horn Towers ESL Pilot Project. Ardie Medina, Development Officer, says "With the support of the Bromelkamp Foundation, the Division of Indian Work's Agindaasodaa! (Let's Read!) Program is able to purchase books for the staff to read to kids and for them to practice reading. Oftentimes the kids can take the books home with them once the program is done for the school year."
